# **North Region Update**

# Yorkshire and Humber

- Sheffield have 8 beds, which is reduced capacity from 9, due to staffing issues. They are not undertaking elective surgery. They expect to be back up to 9 bed capacity later today.
- Leeds also have staffing issues and are down from 12-10 beds this is unlikely to change over the weekend. There is a potential discharge tomorrow. No elective surgery has taken place today
- There are 2 patients pending
  - 1 patient from Chesterfield who potentially can go to Sheffield, if a patient can move to Chesterfield from Sheffield. The patient requires high flow – and so is not able to move to any HDU unit. Derby and Doncaster will be approached for capacity to take if needed to free up a bed.
  - o 1 other child is pending no bed identified
- There is 1 other child on route to a bed in Newcastle
- 1 child (15 years old) remains on an adult ICU and will not now be transferred to a PIC

### North West

- No pending patients
- DGH is managing with a long term ventilated patient, with PIC support and seems to be settling
- Alder Hey have 17 beds open and have accepted 3 transfers from cardiac and 1 from another unit. Do expect some movement - have

- had short term staff sickness today so would expect to open 1-2 more beds over the weekend.
- Alder Hey are recruiting more nurses and expect to be at full capacity for 21 commissioned beds by mid-January
- Manchester full at moment short term staffing issues but should be able to open to full 15 beds later this evening. There are 14 beds open on HDU – 1 more will ICU open over weekend. 1 potential discharge this afternoon.

## North East:

- No elective surgery has taken place RVI is currently full
- Freeman has 8 patients and 1 bed available though referral coming from SCBU
- James Cook has 6 patients and are expecting 2 discharges later today
  level 2 beds.

## Actions:

- Although there is some capacity expected to be freed up later today, consensus was that there would expect to be more referrals later today and therefore as a region we are at CRITCON 2
- Penny to confirm national bed position and CRITCON status with national lead
- Depending on outcome of that to organise a regional or national call on Monday to review situation
- No calls arranged over the weekend but to escalate to on call manager if situation deteriorates to activate a call.
